## What does the Trust fund?


- Specialist equipment
- Safety equipment
- Educational toys
- Early learning aids
- IT equipment

In short, necessary equipment or resources that are not supplied by statutory service and are solely for the use of the child.

## Is there anything that the Trust **doesn't** fund?

- Open ended commitments to continued funding
- Clothing and shoes (except for special or safety items)
- Payment of debts
- Holidays
- Normal household items

## How do I apply for funding?

-  1. Download the application form from our website or by contacting the secretary, Jenny Anderson on 01246 236890.
-  2. Complete an application form providing all of the information requested.
-  3. Send us your application via post/email. (Please see contact details on the back).

Written supporting evidence must be provided by an appropriately qualified professional who knows your child well. For example, buggies, chairs, sensory items and outdoor play equipment should be supported by an Occupational Therapist or Physiotherapist.

## What is the criteria for funding from the Trust?

Your child must have special needs, be under the age of 19 and living in Derbyshire.

All information is treated in confidence and is not shared with any other organisation.
